The Truth explains that we were made to work, to give great effort.

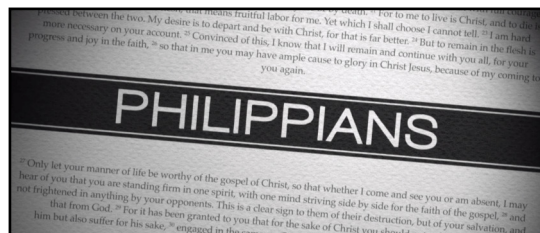
We do this almost naturally in certain areas of our life, but not where and when it counts, which is in our walk with Jesus.
