The crowd is unable to satisfy their spiritual hunger

Jesus' own family, believe Him to be a crazy

Isaiah 40 is one of the best chapters in the Bible for gaining a perspective on how big and powerful God is because the passage compares him to things we can understand. This perspective will be of great help when we experience times in our lives when God's plan makes no sense. Read through the chapter and write down all it says about how big and powerful God is.

In what ways can a greater understanding of God's absolute power help you increase your trust him and his perfect timing?

When we experience one of those times where God's plan isn't making sense, we can wonder if God is even present with us. What hope does Psalm 46 give you even though it may seem like God is not present in the midst of life's difficulties?

Pastor Shannon mentioned 4 ideas to work through as we walk with Jesus and become like Jesus. Which of these is most important for you to remember?

1. Jesus is King, I am God's kid
2. God's plan is always the best plan
3. The right response, does not always bring the right results
4. God's timing is not my timing
